## Some Listable Word-Classes

Listable word classes are small groups of function words that have a primarily grammatical purpose as opposed to the four large content word-classes: nouns, verbs, adjectives and -ly adverbs. The function words have highly specialized uses and can appear on more than one list according to how they are used in a given sentence—e.g. who used as an includer or as a question word; on used as a preposition or as a particle with a phrasal verb.

determiners:

a, an, the; this, that, these, those; my, your, his, her, its, our, their;

includers:

although, because, if, when, who, which, that, etc.

very, quite, rather, sort of, somewhat, a little

joiners:

fanboys for, and, nor, but, or, yet, so and semi-colon

linkers:

However, Therefore, In fact, etc.

middle adverbs:

already, often, never, ever, definitely, surely, clearly, etc.

middle auxiliaries:

be, been, being, have

negatives:

no, not, none, no one, nobody, nothing, never, neither, nor

numerals, cardinal:

one, two, three, etc.

numerals, ordinal:

first, second, third, etc.

particles:

in, on, up, down, out, off, around, etc.

phrasals:

indoors, outdoors, upstairs, downstairs

prepositions:

about, above, across, after, against, among, etc.

pronominals:

he, she, it, they; him, her, them

quantifiers:

some, a little, a lot of, a few, few, several, much, very much, etc.

sequence signals:

then, next, afterwards, finally, etc.

titles:

Ms., Mr., Miss, Mrs. Dr., President, King, Queen, etc.

wh-words:

what, when, where, which, who, whose, whom, etc.

x-words:

do, does, did, have, has, had, am, is, are, etc.
