

TRUNKS WITH JOINERS

Task #7

1. Write one trunk about today's weather and another about the sky. Use two capital letters and two periods.
2. Copy the same two sentences, but *join* them with the word and. Use one capital letter, one comma and one period. Label this sentence T+T (TRUNK + TRUNK).

There are four JOINERS: and, but, so, or (or nor). Yet can also be used as a joiner. So can a semi-colon (T;T).

3. Using but and so as the joiners, write two more sentences that contain *two whole trunks*. Label them T+T. Be sure you can turn both of them into *two whole yes-no questions* without adding or borrowing any words.
4. Write two more sentences with joiners, but this time one should have only one subject but two of everything else. The other should have one subject, one x-word and two verbs. Label both sentences T= (TRUNK WITH TWO PARTS).
