

## TRUNKS WITH LINKERS

Task #8

1. Write one trunk which points out something unattractive about the room you are sitting in. Write another trunk which points out something nice about the same room.
2. Copy the same two sentences, but this time add the word However at the beginning of the second sentence. Label this second sentence LT (LINKER AND TRUNK).

*LINKERS are words or phrases which are used to relate the meaning of one sentence to that of a previous sentence. Therefore, they never begin a "first" sentence.*

3. Using the linkers Therefore, On the other hand and As a matter of fact, write three more *pairs* of sentences that make sense together. Label the second sentence in each pair LT. Be sure you start each sentence with a capital letter and end each one with a period. Use a comma with each linker. *as a result*

EACH PERSON IN YOUR GROUP SHOULD DO THIS TASK INDIVIDUALLY.

1. Write three more sentences about the same relative that you wrote about in Task #6.
  - Label your fifth sentence *T+T* (TRUNK + TRUNK). Use any one of the four joiners and write anything you want to *so long as the two trunks have different subjects*.
  - Label your sixth sentence *T=* (TRUNK WITH TWO PARTS). Tell one thing your relative loves about this city and one thing he hates. Be sure you have a joiner and *one* subject in this sentence.
  - Label your seventh sentence *LT* (LINKER AND TRUNK). You can use any linker you want to start this sentence so long as it makes some logical connection to the sixth sentence or the whole paragraph.
2. Only one of your last three sentences should *not* contain a comma. Which one is it?
